



1) Pending contract negotiations on Dietary/Housekeeping RFP and anticipated contract negotiations on Hospital Study, relative to Runnells Specialized Hospital.

Joan Wheeler provided the board with a brief history of the County's efforts in privatizing the dietary and housekeeping services at Runnells Specialized Hospital. She indicated such efforts began when they were instructed to begin searching for ways to cut their budgets in anticipation of this year's budget adoption.

Joan Wheeler stated that ten (10) vendors downloaded the specifications and only one responded. Their proposal was reviewed by the committee and asked the vendor to revise their proposal's financials because of the inclusion of laundry services in their proposal. Sodexo Inc. complied and provided the revised proposal without the laundry services. The proposal was reviewed by the committee and recommended the County award the contract to Sodexo, Inc.

Director Taylor provided the Board

Director Taylor informed the Board that the County offered Council 8 collective bargaining unit an opportunity in this competitive process. They offered a salary reduction of three (3) days in 2012 and a vacation giveback of four (4) days and meal allowances. Including fringe rate considerations, the savings equated to \$120,000 in 2012 and \$95,000 in 2013.

Director Taylor reinforced to the Board the importance of the Right of First Refusal for its current employees. She stated employees would have opportunities to a 401k; matched by 3%, benefits package which included domestic partnerships, and some options not provided by the County such as stock options. She noted the health benefits would be at a 60-40 split.

County Manager Faella noted all individuals in good standing would be interviewed. He noted that most of the employees were in good standing.

There was a discussion relative to the 101 employees / positions being affected; in particular the number of employees representing dietary services and housekeeping services and whether or not managers were being affected as well. Joan Wheeler advised management would be affected and were included in the 101 figure. She also advised the Board of the effects of employees opting for retirement.

Director Guzzo stated Sodexo's willingness to accommodate our current employee benefits and salaries, noting their generous package and keeping their salaries in line with current rates. He stated the obvious difference is employees will not participate in the PERS system, but they would have other options such as the 401k and stock options.

There was a discussion relative to staffing patterns. Director Taylor noting that it was clearly part of the proposal.

Freeholder Sullivan suggested that we offer the names of those recently laid off to Sodexo for employment to fill any vacancies. Joan Wheeler stated that the proposal specifically outlines an hourly rate of \$15.87 per hour for any new employer outside those employees directly from Runnells Specialized Hospital.

2) Anticipated contract negotiations relative to Jail Study.

Director Frank Guzzo informed the Board that the Administration anticipates awarding two RFPs for studies relative to the operations of Runnells Specialized Hospital and the Union County Jail. The Administration felt it was important to have a Third Party viewpoint in looking at the overall operations and fiscal stability of both facilities.



The Jail Study would look at current conditions relative to posts, staffing and management. Director Guzzo informed the Board that the PBA contract expires at the end of the year and could begin negotiating after the study is completed; which is expected to be completed in 60-90 days. Director Guzzo assured the Board that Director Riordan welcomes the study and looks forward to cooperating with the Third Party.

County Manager Faella reminded the Board of the Luminosity Study which is looking at ways to reduce the jail population. County Manager Faella also assured the Board that the County would be speaking with Hudson County.
