

Schedule A

Chapter 102, PURCHASING AND CONTRACTS

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Union as indicated in article histories. Amendments noted where applicable.]

(ARTICLE I through ARTICLE IV – remains unchanged)

ARTICLE V, Insurance

[Adopted 7-12-1979 by Res. No. 538-79; amended in its entirety 5-25-2000 by Ord. No. 514; amended 3-08-2007 by Ord. No. 644]

§ 102-12. Liability insurance requirements.

The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Union hereby establishes the following requirements for general liability insurance to be obtained and filed by vendors from which this County obtains goods or services:

- A. For contracts where there is direct contact with the public, the insurance requirements are as follows: in an uncontrolled environment limit of \$1,000,000 required for both bodily injury and property damage.
1. Automobile Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than \$2,000,000.00 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage liability.
 2. Workers Compensation Insurance insuring the obligation of the Contractors and all subcontractors under the New Jersey Workers Compensation and Occupational Disease Laws as respects work performed under this Contract. Insurance shall be extended to include any obligations under the United States Longshoremen's and Harbor Workers Act or any maritime Act, when applicable.
 3. General Liability Insurance shall be provided on a Comprehensive General Liability Form with a Combined Single Limit of \$3,000,000.00 per Occurrence for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability and shall include the interest of the County with respect to work emanating from the Contract with the County. This instance shall include the following:
 - (a) Personal Injury Liability,
 - (b) Blanket Contractual Liability applying to assumption of liability under any written Contract,
 - (c) Products and/or Completed Operations Liability

B. ~~C.~~ For contracts having no direct effect on the public, the insurance requirements are as follows: require a \$300,000 limit for bodily injury and a \$100,000 limit for property damage.

1. Automobile Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage liability.
2. Workers Compensation Insurance insuring the obligation of the Contractors and all subcontractors under the New Jersey Workers Compensation and Occupational Disease Laws as respects work performed under this Contract. Insurance shall be extended to include any obligations under the United States Longshoremen's and Harbor Workers Act or any maritime Act, when applicable.
3. General Liability Insurance shall be provided on a Comprehensive General Liability Form with a Combined Single Limit of \$1,000,000.00 per Occurrence for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability and shall include the interest of the County with Respect to work emanating from the Contract with the County. This instance shall include the following:
 - (a) Personal Injury Liability.
 - (b) Blanket Contractual Liability applying to assumption of liability under any written Contract.
 - (c) Products and/or Completed Operations Liability

C. ~~D.~~ The County Counsel and the County Qualified Purchasing Agent in consultation with the County Counsel shall, at all times, have the discretion to modify the insurance coverage requirements of this section on an individual basis in accordance with the requirements of the contract. ~~The County Purchasing Division and/or the County Counsel will, at all times, have the ability to include the additional coverage requirements in accordance with the content of the contract.~~ This paragraph shall apply, without limitation, to individuals and entities, such as consultants or others serving in an advisory capacity, guest lecturers and/or solo practitioners.

E. With respect to automobile insurance, where such coverage is required, the limits shall be not less than \$500,000.
