OPRA provides that, “{U}nless a shorter time period is otherwise provided by statute, a regulation, or executive order, a custodian of a government record shall grant access to a government record or deny a request for access to a government record as soon as possible, but not later than several business days after receiving the request, provided that the record is currently available and not in storage or archived.

I am requesting that the GRC:

- a) declare that the Union County Improvement Authority has violated the OPRA;
- b) Order it to provide me with all records responsive to my requests;
- c) Find that the Union County Improvement Authority denial of access was knowing, willful and unreasonable under the circumstances, and
- d) Impose the civil penalties upon the Union County Improvement Authority as provided for by OPRA.
